

Question - How do I know if I have a cold or the flu?

Answer - We are still seeing flu in San Diego and the surrounding areas. Influenza is caused by a severe, highly contagious virus that infects your lungs. It usually comes on quickly with fever, chills, headache, severe body aches, chest congestion, coughing and a feeling of total exhaustion. The flu can lead to very serious health complications that may land you in the hospital. The best defense against the flu is the flu shot. If you do get the flu, call your doctor right away for a special prescription medicine. As long as you take it within 48 hours, this anti-viral drug may shorten the time you are sick. You will need to stay home and rest for a week or more.

A cold is caused by one of several hundred viruses, and it is milder than the flu. Colds will come on gradually and will be associated with tiredness, mild aches and pains, runny or stuffy nose, sneezing, sore throat and coughing. When you have a cold, it is best to stay home for a few days, rest and drink fluids. A cold can lead to sinus infections, ear infections or a persistent cough. You may need to see a doctor if symptoms worsen.

Flu and cold viruses enter your body through your eyes, nose or mouth. Don't touch your face, stay away from sick people and wash your hands frequently. It's still not too late to get your flu shot.

Family Electric Rate Assistance (FERA) Program: If you don't qualify for CARE, you may for FERA. You could receive a 12% discount on your energy bill. FERA is only open to households with three or more people. sdge.com/FERA

Medical Baseline: This program has helped over 30,000 people, who have a qualifying medical need or medical device, to lower their energy costs. Household income isn't a qualifying factor. sdge.com/medicalbaseline

Energy Savings Assistance (ESA) Program: You may receive free energy-saving improvements for your apartment, condo, house or mobile home; such as lighting, furnace repair, weather-stripping, attic insulation and select appliances like a refrigerator. sdge.com/ESAP
